

School Construction Project Plans Laid; Board Seeking Bids

Permit Holder Faces Hearing

Dodsonville Man Is Cited by Sanitarian

The owner of a tavern and rental cabin business at Dodsonville has been cited before the Ohio Liquor Board for "unsanitary conditions."

The citation was issued by Stanley Delhart, area liquor enforcement agent. No date has been announced for a hearing.

The business, known as Moore's Cabins, is owned and operated by Donald Moore. It is located near the juncture of Route 134 and Route 50 in the western Highland County village.

At the same time, Pryor Link, county sanitarian, revealed that he has given Moore 10 days notice to clean up his premises.

REVIEWING the case, the sanitarian said he had checked Moore's place on March 16. At that time, he gave the proprietor 30 days notice to clean up the establishment.

Link said he deliberately stayed away for a period of 90 days, giving Moore ample opportunity to bring his premises "up to health department standards." Following an inspection last week, Link issued the 10-day notice when the check indicated that "nothing had been done."

"Many places in the county are cooperating in meeting regulations," Link explained, "but there are others that just don't want to do anything." He indicated he was past the "lenient stage" with this latter type.

Both Delhart and Link reported that they had been making

Final Drawing Of New Building Is Presented

Advertising for bids on the construction of a new school building at Webster grounds was begun this week by the Hillsboro board of education.

Formal action to initiate the advertising was taken following a meeting of the board with architect representatives Thursday night at the school administration building.

Bids on the project will be received until noon on July 20, when they will be opened and examined.

Architects exhibited final drawings of the buildings, including electrical, heating, room layouts and other details, at the meeting with the board. No major changes were effected in the final plans, Paul L. Upp, superintendent, said.

BIDS ARE to be received for general construction, plumbing, heating, electrical work and fixtures, flooring and equipment.

The board reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to withhold final awarding of the contract for 30 days after opening of the bids.

Meanwhile, work of clearing trees from the Webster ground is underway. This project was started last week. Trees on the north and south sides of the old school had to be removed in order to make room for the new building. Jim Preston was awarded a contract by the board to remove the trees and some of the stumps.

Upp expressed regret that some of the trees had to come down because of their beauty and shade but the new building will encircle the main section of the old Webster building, right at the spot where the trees are located.
