to suffer them to such humiliation," Mrs. Williamson said, "it will only be for a little while, until after the court hears our case."

Francis said that he believed segregated schools are not only bad for the colored children, but for the whites as well. Both he and Mrs. Lee, during her talk to the group, pointed out that the adults were the ones who enforce segregation rulings. The children will take care of the problems themselves, if left alone, they said.

THE NAACP officials said, "We can understand Mr. Upp's position on the matter. It takes time for public opinion to crystalize. However, as far as overcrowded schools are concerned, they would have undoubtedly made room for 67 new white children if they had moved into the district."

Francis said that in other areas where schools are overcrowded, classes are held on a half-day basis, a plan which would work here.

All officers of the group, both state and local, called upon the members to be orderly and to act as good American citizens. They urged the parents to offer no retaliation such as "fussing, fighting M or arguing" when their children are turned away from the white schools.
