

# Board of Education Holds Final Meeting; Purchase Insurance

## New Plan Covers Boilers, Other Heat Equipment

The Hillsboro board of education met Monday night to wind up business for the current calendar year. The board will reconvene next Monday to organize for the coming year. Major action of the session was the purchase of damage insurance to cover heating boiler units in three buildings.

The insurance, obtained through the local insurance association, covers the boilers and equipment at the high school, Webster School and administration buildings. Washington will probably be added later.

The coverage had been discussed in some detail at the regular December meeting. A policy covering three years was contracted by the board, providing \$50,000 coverage for damage to the furnace units, the buildings and other property.

**BILLS** available up to the time of the meeting were approved and paid to clear the books for the current year.

Superintendent Paul L. Upp said he had always recommended the insurance purchased, particularly since it includes one of the most thorough and practical inspections obtainable.

Announcement was made that the superintendent and Marvel K. Wilkin, board president, had been subpoenaed to appear in U. S. district court at Cincinnati this week. Helen Ash, teacher at Lincoln school, was also subpoenaed.

Informally, the board discussed the operation of the new furnace at Webster School and some of the difficulty encountered in hooking up the old system. They also discussed school finances under the new program now being drawn up by special committees and the current elementary building program.

The new year will bring no letup in the number of problems of getting the new buildings completed, purchasing and equipment moved, and purchasing, the members

A membership in the association entitles the holder to vote for the board of directors, who will be elected at the annual hospital membership meeting on Friday, Jan. 14. Eight directors are to be elected.

All members of the association are urged to attend this meeting.
