Negroes Seek Reversal Of Court's Move

Notice of appeal in the Hillsboro school case involving Negro children was filed in U. S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth District at Cincinnati, Wednesday. It had been predicted here last week that the appeal would be filed.

The appeal to the court will seek to reverse a decision by Judge John H. Druffel, Jan. 28. At that time, Judge Druffel refused to grant a permanent injunction against the Hillsboro board of education which would have forced the board to reassign several Negro children to the Washington and Webster Schools.

Judge Druffel denied the injunction because the school board here officially favored integration and had a construction program underway which would make it practical to accomplish in two years. The judge held also that an injunction would upset the school system.

The notice of appeal, which is a forerunner to submission of briefs and papers in the case, was filed by attorneys for National Association for Advancement of Colored People, who have been handling the case for five local plaintiffs.
